„QUO VADIS, HUMAN?“ (Where is this world going?)

The motto of the competition: *"Now that we have learned to fly the air like birds, swim under water like fish, we lack one thing—to learn to live on earth as human beings."* (George Bernard Shaw)

We live in an amazing twenty-first century. Life has never been so easy as today. We have a roof over our heads, enough to eat, our drinking water flows directly from the tap, deadly epidemics do not threaten us, the world in which we live is relatively safe. We have access to information, education, we have freedom. We have things that make our lives easier than our parents could never have imagined... So we have everything we need for a satisfied and happy life. But ... Are we really happy? What do we still lack?

This year's competition "Quo vadis, human?" bears the subtitle "Where is this world going?" and aims to encourage young people to respond to current events in human society by artistic means. Within the competition you can tackle any current issues that resonate in the human society, whether at local, regional or global level. Your fantasy ...

Since this is an international competition, we assume that the interpretation of this theme will vary, bring different points of view, which of course is our intention. Thanks to it we can see perception of reality of young people from different cultures which brings international dialogue on the artistic level.

Deadline: 18.11.2016

Conditions:

- The competition is open to young people, both individuals and teams, aged 14-20 years of age, with a maximum of three works by each competitor or team
- Any form of art can be used - two-dimensional art (including computer graphics), multimedia presentations, music, film ...
- The entries should be sent solely in electronic form in JPG, PDF, or AVI / DIVX / MP4, max. file size to 15 megabytes (in the case of larger files on CD or DVD by post).
- All entries have to be accompanied by a completed application form and contain the following information: name and age of the author (in the case of collective works give details of all), the technique in which the work was made, contact information (address of the author - home or school) .
- Committee also judges the idea that is contained in the work, do not ignore this information. Describe in the application what your work represents.
- In the case of foreign language texts, attach the in English.
- Selected works will be printed and displayed, the organizers reserve the right to select works for the exhibition and the right not to award all the prizes.
- Internet voting will start after the deadline for sending works and will last until 30.11.2016.

- All works will be included in the online voting, and published on our website: www.rcm.sk
- Results will be published no later than one week after the end of electronic voting.

Contest categories:

I. Two-dimensional work of art (all art technology + computer graphics)

II. Multimedia works (powerpoint slideshows, videos, music ...)

Internet voting – prize for work most voted for

Exhibition of the best works (in printed form) will be opened in the premises of Regional Youth Centre from 12.12.2016.

Ceremonial announcement of winners will be within the conference on international mobility "You can also change it" Estimated date is the first half of December 2016. The place and time will be announced, the winners and teams will be invited to the conference.
